MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Borough of Mendham Residents and Business Owners:

Hi, my name is Jim Kelly. Many of you already know me as a lifelong resident of Mendham. I was born here, grew up here, and went to school in Mendham with my five brothers and sisters. It is where I developed lifelong



friendships, and created a heating, plumbing, and cooling business. It is where my wife Frederica and I raised our two children, Kate and Connor. It is the place we call home.

After serving on Council for six years, both as Council President and Chair of Finance Committee, I was appointed Mayor of Mendham on February 24, 2025, after Mayor Serrano Glassner stepped down from her role to take a position in the White House. As I move forward in my new role, 2025 is shaping out to be a year of change and transformation for our community. We have a new Recreation and Communications Coordinator and are committed to working hard to expand our recreation programs and community events for the community. A major milestone this year has been the completion of the much-needed stabilization and renovation of the 1810 Historic Phoenix House. A project that Mayor Serrano Glassner and our Borough's Administrator secured \$1.1 million in historic grant funding to make possible. Moving further into 2025, it has become clear that we cannot continue to neglect our valuable infrastructure. Alongside our work on the Phoenix House, we must continue implementing newer technologies, updating our Public Works buildings, and upgrading our police department facilities to better serve our citizens.

We must also address development in our community. As a lifelong resident of Mendham, I have seen changes to the farms we worked on and the woods we played in as children. They became the places where we now shop, go to Church, and school, homes and condos we live in, and senior housing. I, like most residents, do not like change. Change is always challenging, but despite the changes, we still call Mendham home. It is my hope that we can manage Mendham's future while maintaining our sense of community. I believe in our hometown of Mendham and know we will manage what comes our way.

The Borough of Mendham Police Department enforces all criminal, local and motor vehicle laws of the State of New Jersey to keep our community and streets safe. Officers routinely patrol the Borough's business and residential areas watching for suspicious activity to prevent crime and aid residents. The Borough police officers respond to ALL emergency calls including fire and first-aid calls. Police patrol cars are equipped with first-aid equipment including defibrillators. Several officers are also EMT certified.

The police department also provides important community services, such as child car seat installation/inspection, vacant house checks, community crime prevention programs, safety programs, school programs such as Law Enforcement Against Drugs (LEAD) and tours for local organizations.

The Police Department's Business Office hours are Monday-Friday 9:00 am to 4:00 pm (excluding holidays). <u>To file a police report</u> or speak with an officer, call **973-543-2527** any time of day or night, seven days a week. There is no need to wait for the business office to open. The patrol officers on duty are always willing to help and speak with you. Just request the dispatcher to have an officer call you or stop by at your location.

Black Horse Pub and Tavern



The oldest continuing food establishment in New Jersey, as both an inn and restaurant has sat at the Black Horse's present location since the early eighteenth century. Phoenix House and Garden



The Phoenix House, constructed around 1805, originated as an academy for young ladies, and was built one year prior to the completion of the Washington Turnpike in 1806. William Phoenix bought the building for use as an inn in 1820. From 1857 to 1907 it was used by his daughters as a genteel boarding house --though legend has it that Miss Phoenix continued to sell liquor through a side-door in the kitchen. The building is a fine example of the Federal style, with a Greek Revival-style porch added in 1838. The Phoenix House was donated to the Borough by Senator & Mrs. Arthur Whitney in 1938. Since then, it has been the home of the Borough of Mendham Municipal Offices. In early 2024, the building closed for renovations and restoration efforts. Re-opening in early 2025, Visitors are welcome to stop in the building and see its historic interior or spend time in the tranquil Phoenix House Garden, cared for by the Mendham Garden Club since 1938.
